RELEASE OF LIABILITY AND ASSUMPTION OF RISK AGREEMENT FOR CHILDREN
PLAYING UP INTO OLDER AGE DIVISIONS GROUPS ABOVE THEIR OWN

This is a release of liability and assumption of risk agreement. Read it carefully and sign below. Completion of this release is a prerequisite to participation in any age division for a player that is above their own age division.

This release essentially says that my son/daughter _____ (name of player) is physically fit and capable by elevated skills of participating in a higher age division than their own. We know and fully understand that any participation in games or practices having to do with a team with MYSA involves numerous risks, dangers and hazards, both known and unknown, where serious accidents can occur, participants can sustain physical injuries, damage to their property, and even suffer fatal injury. If he/she is hurt, injured or suffers a fatal injury, we (i.e., the player, parents and heirs) will not make a claim against or sue Manteca Youth Softball Association (hereinafter MYSA), its trustees, officers, employees & agents, or expect them to be responsible or pay for any damages.

In consideration for MYSA allowing the player to participate in the older age division, we voluntarily agree to release, waive, discharge and hold harmless MYSA and their trustees, officers, employees & agents from any and all claims of liability arising out of their negligence, or any other act or omission which causes the player illness, injury, death and damages of any nature in any way connected with player;s participatin in this activity.

WE, THE UNDERSIGNED, HAVE READ THIS DOCUMENT. WE UNDERSTAND THAT IT IS A RELEASE OF ALL CLAIMS. WE FURTHER UNDERSTAND THAT WE ARE ASSUMING ALL RISK INHERENT IN THE PARTICIPATION OF OUR CHILD IN AN OLDER AGE DIVISION OF OUR REQUEST. WE VOLUNTARILY SIGN OUR NAME AS EVIDENCE OF OUR ACCEPTANCE OF THE ABOVE PROVISION.
